Marin Pollen Project

2012 Marin Pollen Project Update:

In 2012, the Marin Pollen Project, in conjunction with Maryann Frazier and the Pennsylvania State University Colony Collapse Disorder team, will conduct a study to assess pesticide use and potential impacts on pollinators in urban environments in Marin County.

27 beekeepers have volunteered to collect monthly pollen samples from hives in 43 locations across Marin. This pollen will then be screened by Penn State for some 172 different pesticide residues. The results will be shared with the greater community in order to help educate the general public of the problems beekeepers are experiencing locally with pollinator populations and how individuals can help be a part of the solution.

At this time, the area in/around Sausalito is the largest urban area in the county not represented. If you - or a beekeeper you know in Sausalito - might be interested in participating, please contact Bonnie Bollengier: info@marinpollen.org.

In May we began a campaign to raise money for this important research. We are pleased to report that we have exceeded our goal of \$10,000 to fund the project thanks to the generosity of many beekeepers and other wonderful people.
